Stay Protected from RSV



Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) is a common respiratory virus that can cause severe, life threatening symptoms in infants. It's the leading cause of hospitalization in infants.



The first immunization to protect infants against RSV is now available.

During the months of September through January, pregnant people 32 - 36 weeks should get the RSV vaccine (Abrysvo).





If the vaccine was not received by the birth parent during pregnancy, infants younger than 8 months should receive a dose of Nirsevamib (Beyfortus) during RSV season.
