GONORRHEA

Gonorrhea is a common sexually transmitted infection (STI) caused by the *bacterium Neisseria gonorrhoeae*.

What is Gonorrhea?	 Common infection among both men and women ages 15-24 years Cause infections in the genitals, rectum, and throat
How is Gonorrhea Spread?	 Gonorrhea can be spread through vaginal, anal, or sex with someone who already has gonorrhea Gonorrhea can be passed from pregnant mother to baby during childbirth
Signs and Symptoms of Gonorrhea	 Women with symptoms may notice: increased vaginal discharge a painful or burning sensation when urinating vaginal bleeding between periods Men with symptoms may notice: a discharge from their penis a burning sensation when urinating pain and swelling in one or both testicles Rectal infections in both men and women may or may not cause symptoms: discharge, anal itching, soreness bleeding or painful bowel movements
How is Gonorrhea Diagnosed?	 Urine test Throat and/or rectal swabs
Risk Factors for Gonorrhea	 Anyone who has unprotected vaginal, anal or oral sex can get Gonorrhea Gay, bisexual, and other men who have sex with men
What Happens if Gonorrhea is Not Treated?	 Infertility Ectopic Pregnancy Long-term pelvic/abdominal pain Scar tissue formation that blocks fallopian tubes
How Can Gonorrhea Infection be Avoided?	 Abstinence Use condoms (male and female condoms are available)
